## COMPETITION ANNOUNCEMENT FOR N. 3 RESEARCH AWARDS FUNDED BY THE BANCA STABIESE SPA FOR THE ASSOCIAZIONE INTERNAZIONALE DI STUDI TARDOANTICHI

- 1. The ASSOCIAZIONE INTERNAZIONALE DI STUDI TARDOANTICHI (from now on AIST), with registered office in Naples, in Via Francesco Paolo Michetti n. 5, announces a competition to award 3 research prizes, aimed at young scholars who, in Italy and/or abroad, have already obtained their Doctoral degree having discussed texts in disciplines (history, law, literature and philology, philosophy, archaeology, numismatics, epigraphy) relating to Late Antiquity. The amount of each prize is of 5.000 euros and is paid by Banca Stabiese SPA that participates in this initiative. The winners will be awarded in a public gathering and will be required to enrol, free of charge and with reimbursement of board and lodging expenses, in the cycle of seminars "Law, history and literature of the Late Antique world", promoted by AIST during 2022. The seminars will take place in Naples, in Castellammare di Stabia and/or in the surrounding area, according to a schedule that will be announced in due course. The amount of each research award will be paid at the end of the seminars.
- 2. The competition is open to scholars of any nationality. Applicants must not have reached their thirty-fifth birthday before the final deadline of this Announcement and must be in possession of their doctoral degree, (with the defence of the related dissertation) obtained in the two years prior to the same date. Applicants must submit, as indicated in the following art. 3, the application form, as well as a curriculum vitae in European format, a copy of a valid identity document, a copy of the doctoral thesis in one of the disciplines indicated in art. 1, and a research project in the aforementioned disciplines. The judgement of the Commission will focus exclusively on these last two titles.
- 3. The application must be received by AIST, at the certified email address (PEC) associazioneinternazionalestuditardoantichi@pec.it by 23.59 pm of 31.5.2021. The PEC must have the following object: AIST RESEARCH AWARDS.

Applicants must declare under penalty of exclusion and under their own responsibility in the application form (downloadable at www.studitardoantichi.org) the following data: name and surname, personal information, tax code number, absence of criminal convictions, full address, telephone, e-mail address and PEC; University or Institution where the doctoral degree was awarded, date of achievement, title of the thesis. In addition to the copy of the identity document, the applicant must attach his / her doctoral thesis, his / her research project and his / her *curriculum vitae* to the application. The application and all attachments must be sent only and exclusively in electronic pdf format. Works written in a language other than Italian, French, German, English, Spanish must be accompanied by a broad and detailed summary in one of these languages. The Selection Committee will be appointed by the AIST Board of Directors after the deadline for the call has expired. The Commission will announce the winners of the research awards with an unquestionable motivated judgement within 2021.

In any case, the Commission reserves the right not to award the prizes if no application fulfils the purposes set out in this announcement.

- 4. The results descending from the awarded research projects, subjected to peer review by two anonymous referees, may be published, in the event of a positive judgment, in the journal Κοινωνία (official organ of AIST) or in the Series "Collana di Studi e Testi di Κοινωνία".
- 5. The personal data provided by the applicants will be processed in compliance of the rules concerning the protection of personal data: D.Lgs. 30 June 2003 n.196 and the GDPR (EU Regulation 2016/679). The data will be processed exclusively to perform the activities necessary for the execution of this announcement.
